To Whom It May Concern,

Cure SMA is the leading national organization representing and supporting individuals with spinal muscular atrophy (SMA) and their families, many of whom experience unique and complex health needs daily. This letter requests your support to allow your employee, who serves as a personal care attendant for a client with SMA, to continue to provide services as we continue community reopening following the COVID-19 pandemic.

SMA often requires critical in-home personal care services to support adults and children with SMA in activities of daily living. These activities include feeding, toileting, dressing, shopping, meal preparation, and other critical personal activities. Without these services, people with SMA are unable to function and live independently, and are at risk for deterioration in their health and welfare.

During this continuing pandemic, it remains a high priority that people with SMA remain healthy and safe. COVID-19 poses a greater threat to individuals with SMA, specifically as it relates to respiratory health. It is of utmost importance to keep this vulnerable community as safe as possible.

As stated above, you employ a personal care attendant who supports a member of the SMA community in their home. This letter serves as documentation to allow this individual to transit to and from their residence, as well as to the grocery store or pharmacy to ensure their physical and medical needs are being met. As a home-based care provider employer, I hope that you will exempt this personal care attendant from any restrictions during their scheduled shifts.
